Advice to new owners and contract of sale

This is to give you essential advice, to help you and your puppy in the early days. Some of this information will be required by your veterinary surgeon, who you should visit to examine your puppy within 48 hours of purchase. Whilst we believe the puppy was fit for sale and examined by our vet at 6 weeks of age, should your vet find any defect whereby the puppy was unfit for sale, at the time of purchase, you may return the puppy forthwith and we honour to refund the purchase price in full. We accept no liability for your costs incurred or liability for any stress or trauma this may cause.

DIET

Your dog has been gradually weaned from its mother at three weeks of age. It is now on a balanced diet of puppy biscuit. We supply you with a sample of this, sufficient for the next 48 hours.

There are a vast selection of balanced puppy biscuit foods available on the market and if you change to your preferred choice, blend the two for the second and third days.

At present on three meals a day, the amount should be gradually increased according to the directions of the manufacturer, of your selected brand. Water should always be available.

THE SIRE AND DAM

You have purchased a pedigree Labrador, who is registered with, The Kennel Club. The parents and their ancestors in the pedigree and well beyond have also been registered with The Kennel Club. Both parents have current clear eye certificates, issued by an approved ophthalmic vet and they have both been X-rayed and hip scored by an approved panel of experts. This is to ensure that both parents are free from genetically inherited eye defects and the risk of hip dysplasia. These tests greatly minimise the risk of passing on defects, but does not act as an absolute guarantee. The results are printed on the puppy's registration document. We give no guarantee as to the puppies future breeding potential, working ability and temperament or suitability for show.

INOCULATION

Your puppy was given its first inoculation at 6 weeks and also examined by our vet at Pinewood. It is due its second inoculation at 10 / 12 weeks of age. Do not place the puppy on public ground, or allow it to come into contact with other animals that have been on public ground, until advised by your vet.

WORMING

This was carried out at four weeks and repeated at seven weeks using Drontal Puppy wormer. For further advice you should consult your vet.

TRAINING AND EXERCISE

It is best if the puppy understands that it has its own place in the home or outside kennel. If house training, handy to an outside door. Basic social training such as sit, stay, lie down and walking on a lead at heel, can be gradually worked on if you put in a few minutes at a time daily. Lots of praise and encouragement, never subdue or punish. The more patience you have, the better the result. Controlled socialising with other people and other dogs is essential. Never over exercise a young dog, little and often, is best.

ENDORSEMENTS

The pedigree has been endorsed R, Progeny not eligible for registration.

If you wish to breed from the puppy in future, it must have a current clear eye certificate and be hip scored in accordance with the BVA, KC scheme. I will then instruct the Kennel Club to remove the endorsement. In the unlikely event of me being unavailable to carry out this instruction the bearer of this signed document has my authority to instruct the KC to lift this endorsement, providing you have met the requirements I have requested.
